Sauna and art museum visit

On Tuesday, July 5th, we offer you a choice of outings. You can choose between a guided tour to the Helsinki Art Museum (HAM) and a chance to enjoy a real Finnish sauna. As the number of participants is limited for both outings, please register by email

jure2016helsinki@gmail.com early to avoid disappointment! You can pay for the outings at the info point after registering for the conference (cash only).

The current **HAM exhibition** includes works by many Finnish early modernists, as well as the most important works of Tove Jansson, internationally best known as the “mother” of the Moomins. The guided tour starts at 18 o’clock, and will last approximately 50 minutes. The cost of the outing is 10-15€, with a maximum of 25 participants. The museum is located in the city center, within an easy walking distance from the conference venue.

The **sauna** evening will take place in Rastila, about half an hour’s metro ride from the city center and the conference venue. We have separate saunas for women and men, which both fit 15 people. Our *saunavuoro*, or “sauna turn”, will start at 19 o’clock, and will last for two hours, with a possibility of having a swim in the sea. The cost of the outing is 10-20€, and light snacks will be served. Bring a swimming costume and a towel! Do also note we will be taking the metro, which will cost 2.70€ each way. Tickets can be bought from ticket machines at the metro station. For both outings, we can take the trip together, starting from the conference venue. For the sauna, we will leave at 18 o’clock, and for the museum outing, at 17:30.

Conference dinner

The conference dinner will be held on Thursday, July 7th from 19-23 o’clock. The venue is the Suomenlinna fortress island, a UNESCO World Heritage site in the Helsinki archipelago, some twenty minutes by ferry from the Market Square in the heart of town. The dinner will be served at the Tenaille von Fersen, the old granary of the fortification’s bakery, built in 1775. There will be a short walk of about 15 minutes from the ferry, and as the location is an island, you will want both to wear shoes you can walk in and to bring something warmer to wear as the evening cools down. Please note you can make the trip by yourselves, or we can arrange for people to go together with one of us “locals”. We will

have volunteers at the terminal in Suomenlinna to direct people to the venue, and the route is also signposted.

Public transport day tickets

PLEASE NOTE that we strongly recommend you buy public transport day tickets for your stay in Helsinki. These cover unlimited travel on all trams, buses, the metro, and the Suomenlinna ferry, and will make moving from place to place much smoother. Day tickets are available for 1-7 day periods, and can be bought from the blue ticket machines, as well as from the R-kioski chain. Single fares for trams, buses, and the metro range between 2.50€ and 3.20€, and, for example, a three-day ticket is 16€.
